**AUTISM AWARENESS DAY (2021-22):**

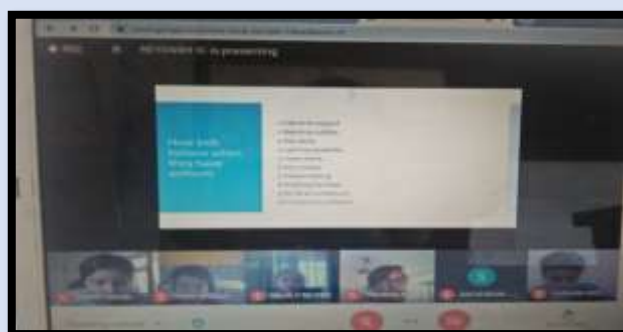
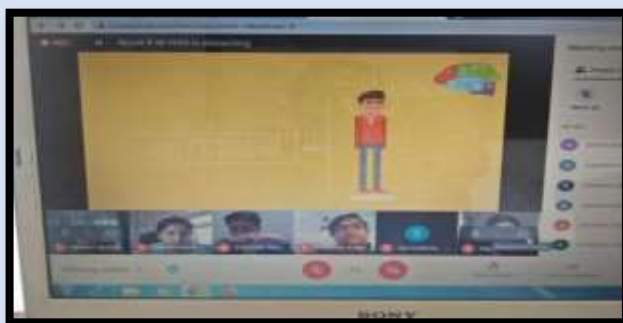
**“Autism is not a disability, it’s a different ability “-Stuart Duncan**

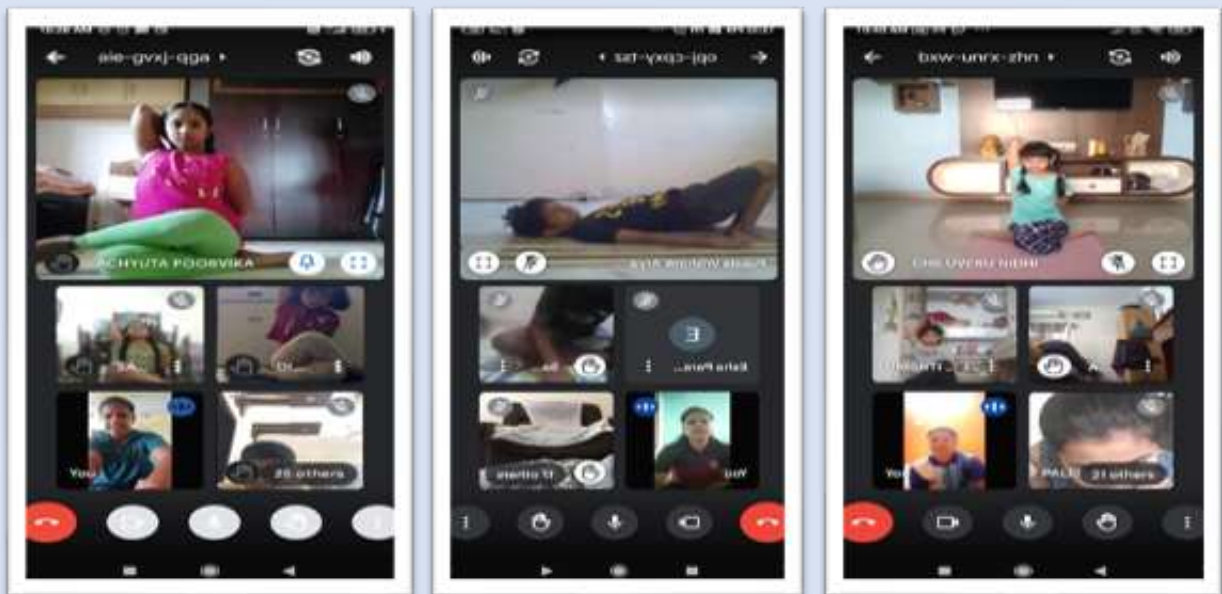

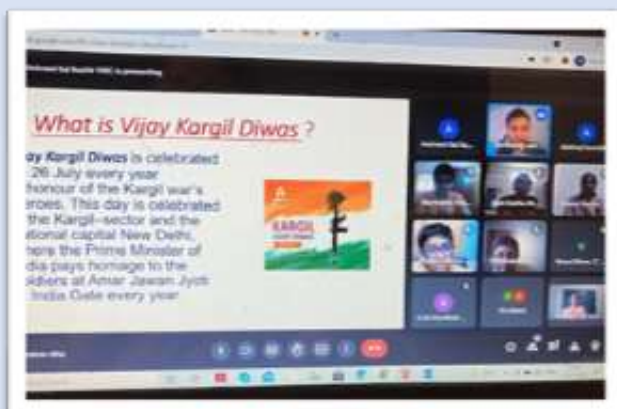
## WORLD POPULATION DAY:

## BONALU CELEBRATIONS:

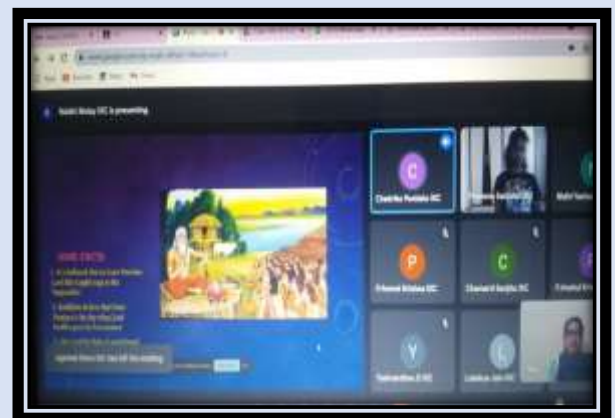

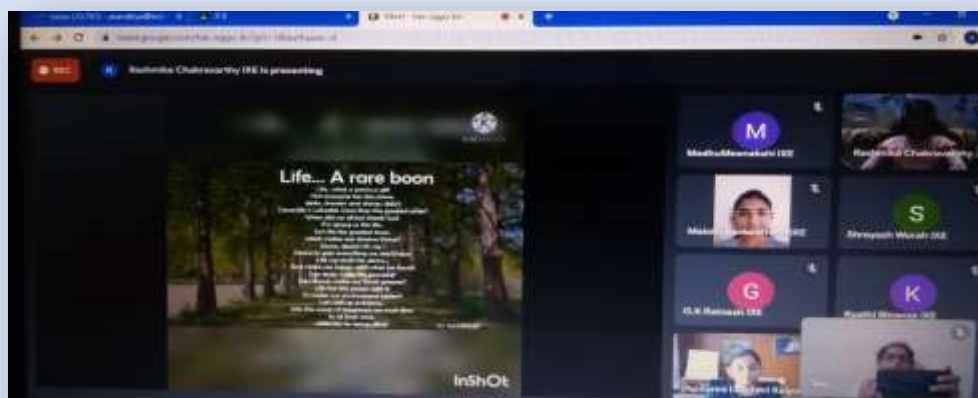
## CBSE-READING WEEK CELEBRATIONS:

In the prize distribution ceremony that followed the winners of Toycathon 2021, National level competition was rewarded marking their achievement. On this positive note the program concluded.

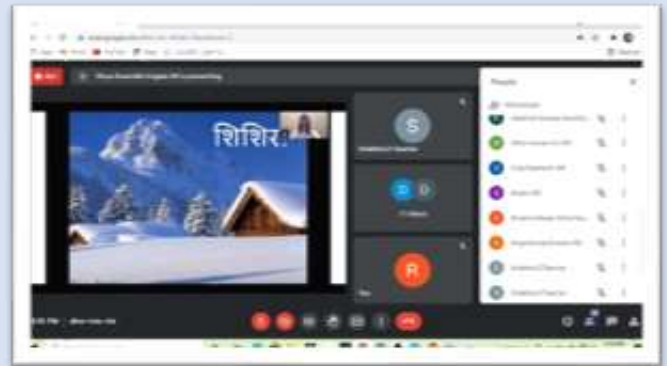


### SANSKRIT WEEK:

The students enthusiastically participated in Quiz on the epic Ramayana and sang classical songs in the divine language concluding the weeklong celebrations.

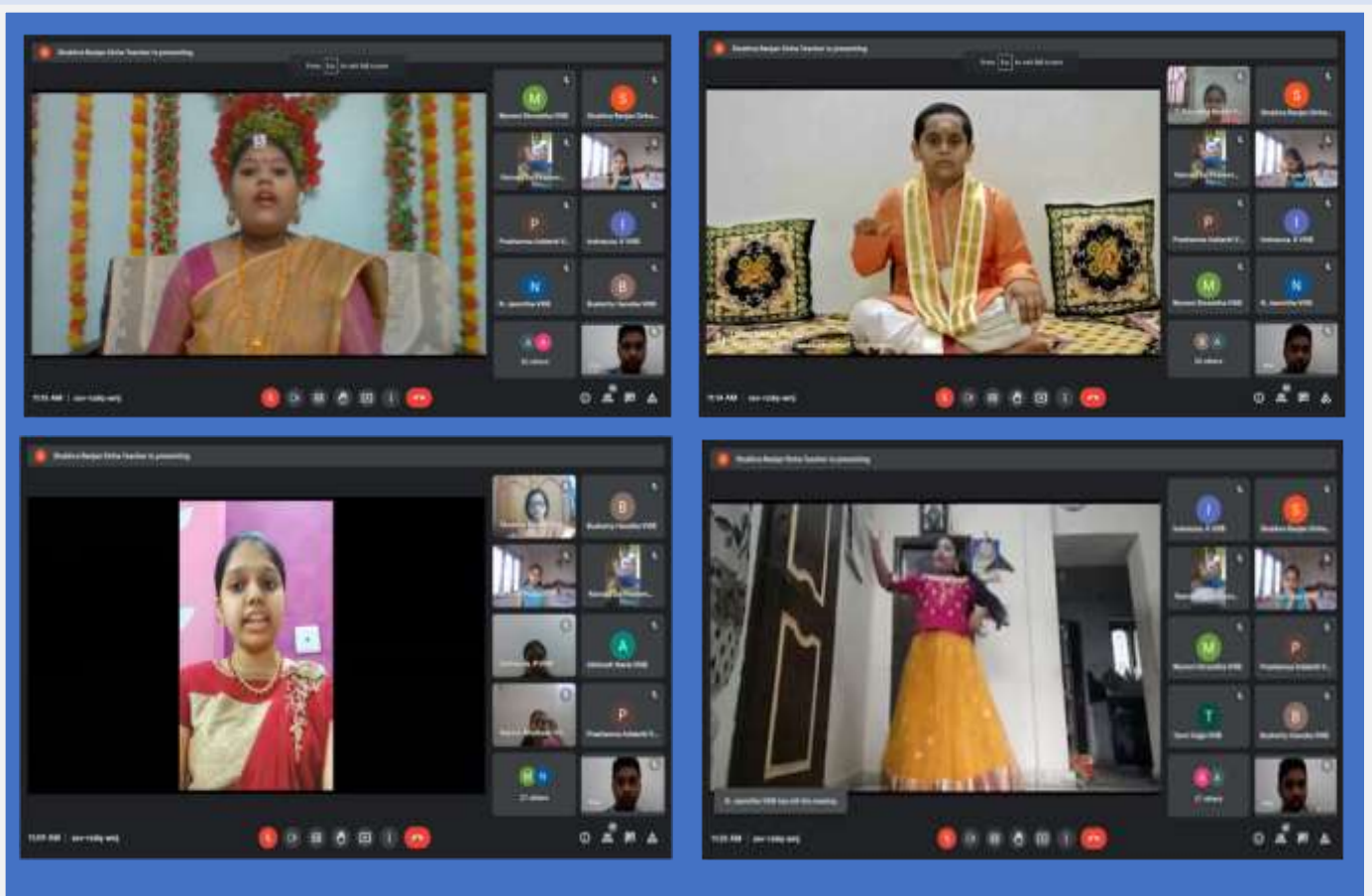


### VARALAKSHMI VRATAM:

### Joy of Giving Week Celebration:

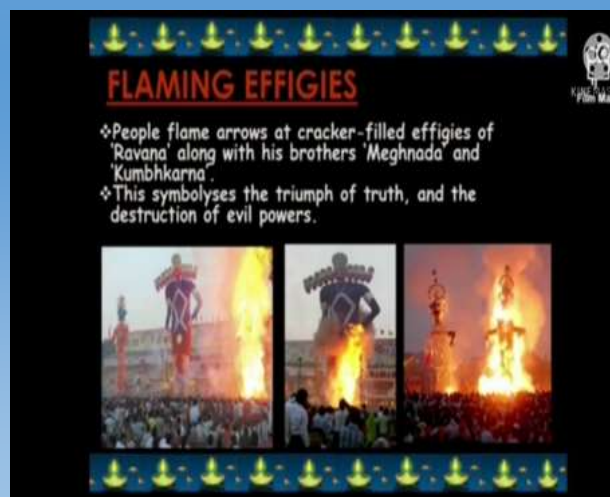
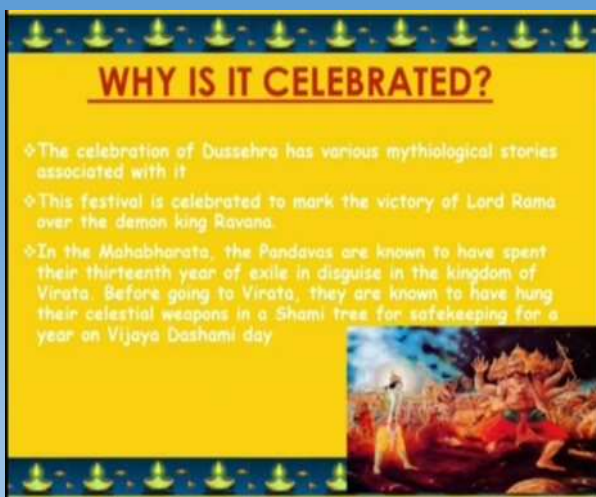

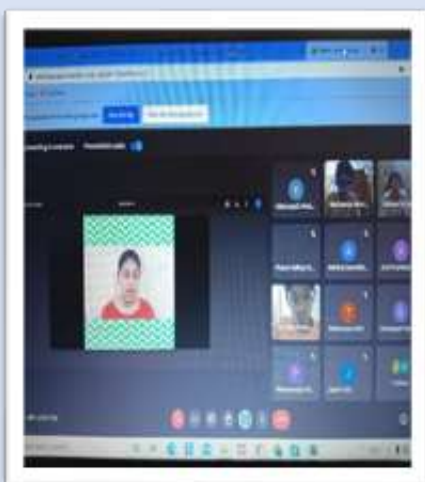
### **Vigilance Awareness Week:**

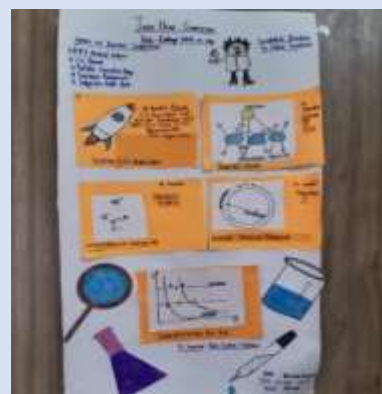
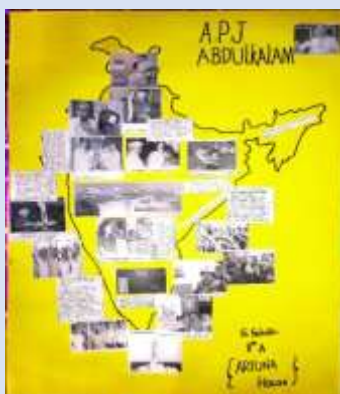

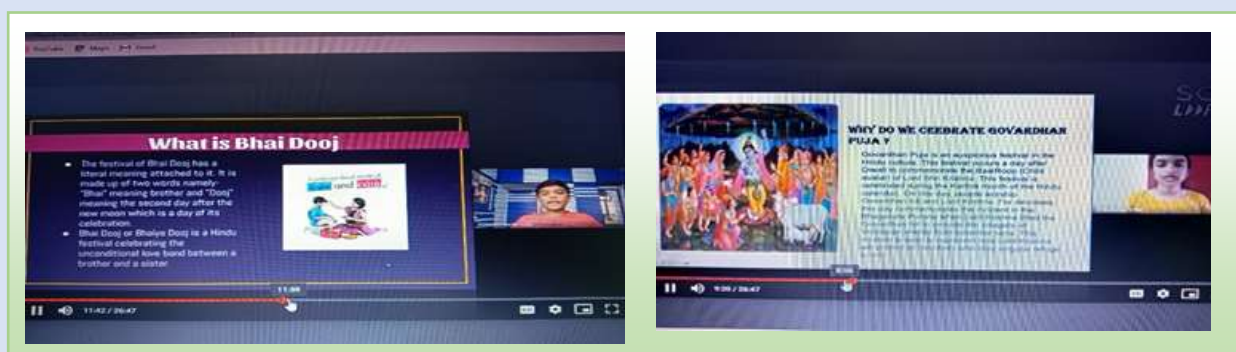
## November, 2021

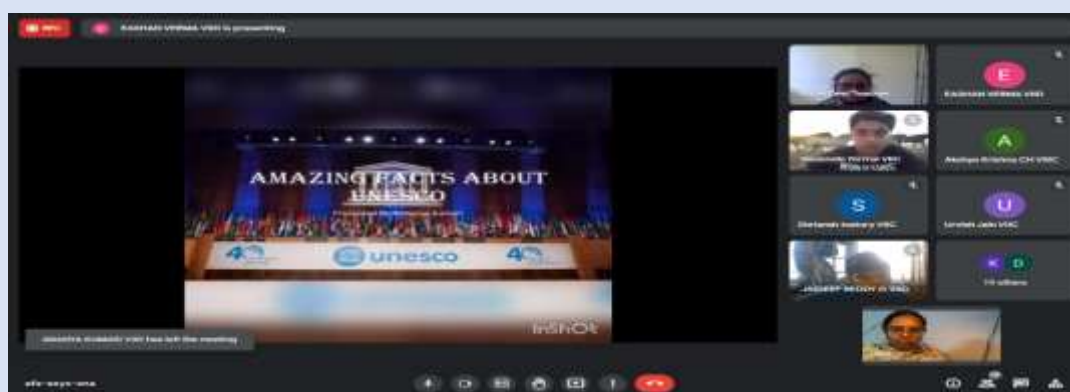
The programme ended with wishing everyone a safe, sound and Happy Diwali.

### ***World Habitat Day:***

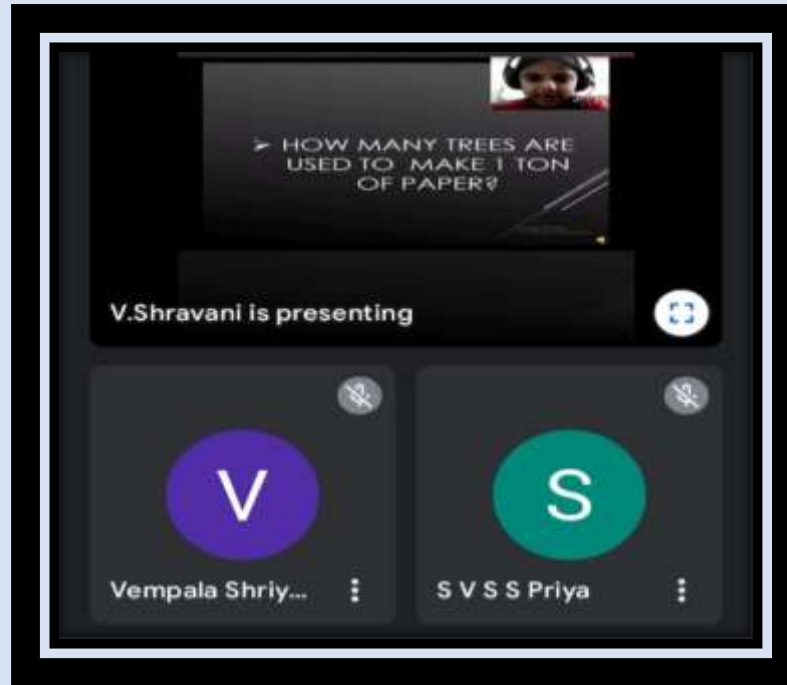

Not only presenting about the significance of the day, the students spoke about the rights framed by UN highlighting the aims and objectives of the day.

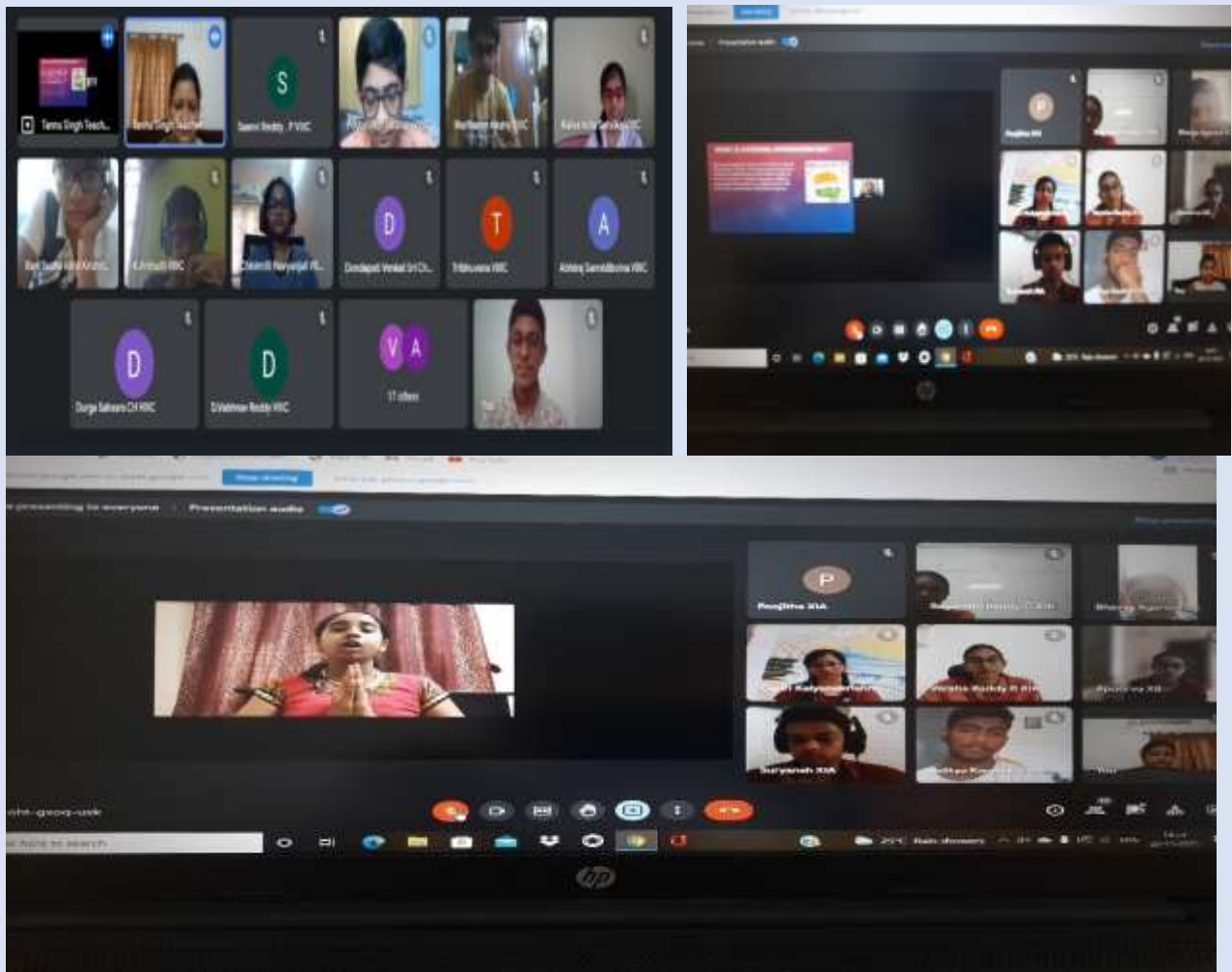
The programme concluded with a song dedicated to the basic rights of the student’s ensuring development, survival, protection and participation to every child.

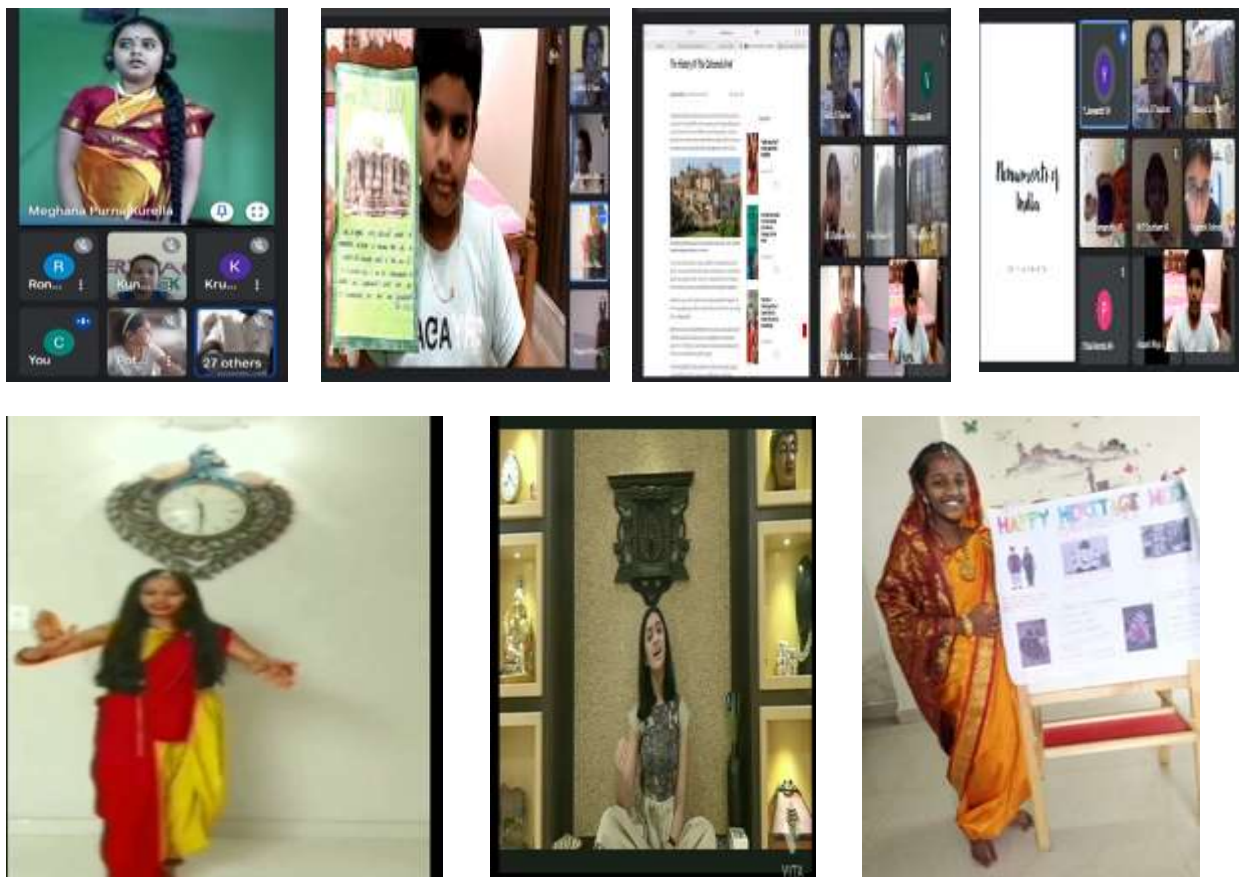


### ***World Heritage Week Celebrations:***

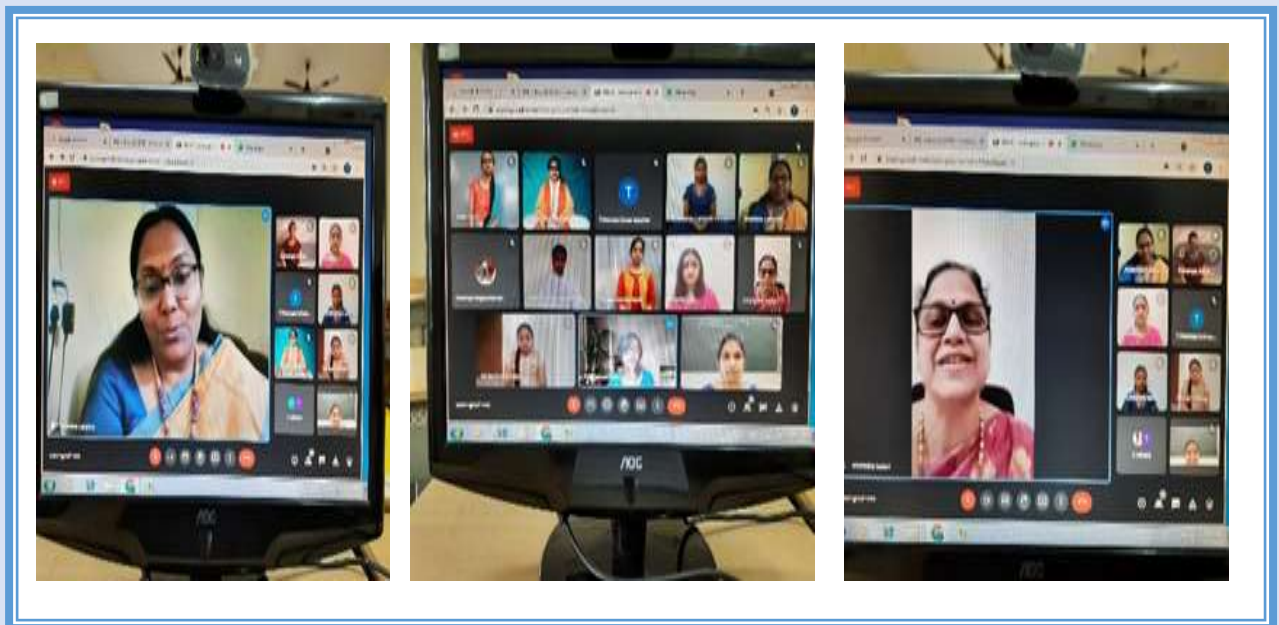

It was proved once again that there is magic in Art, which transcends all barriers and unites the masses as one.

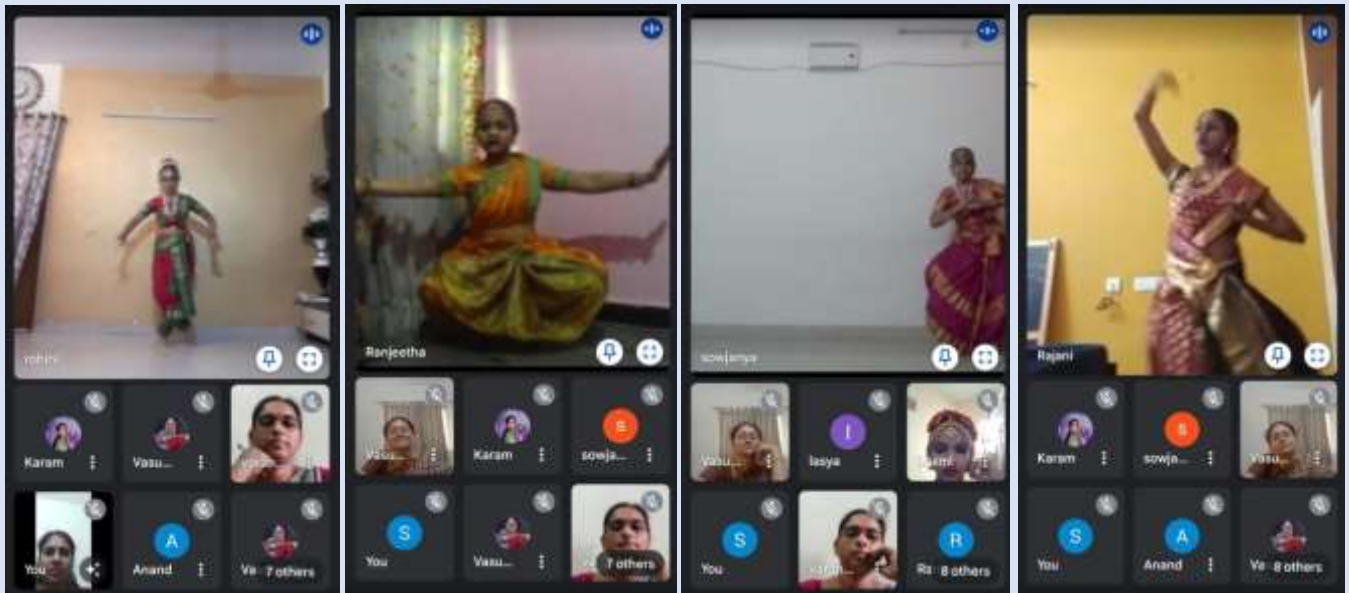

#### **Human Rights Day:**

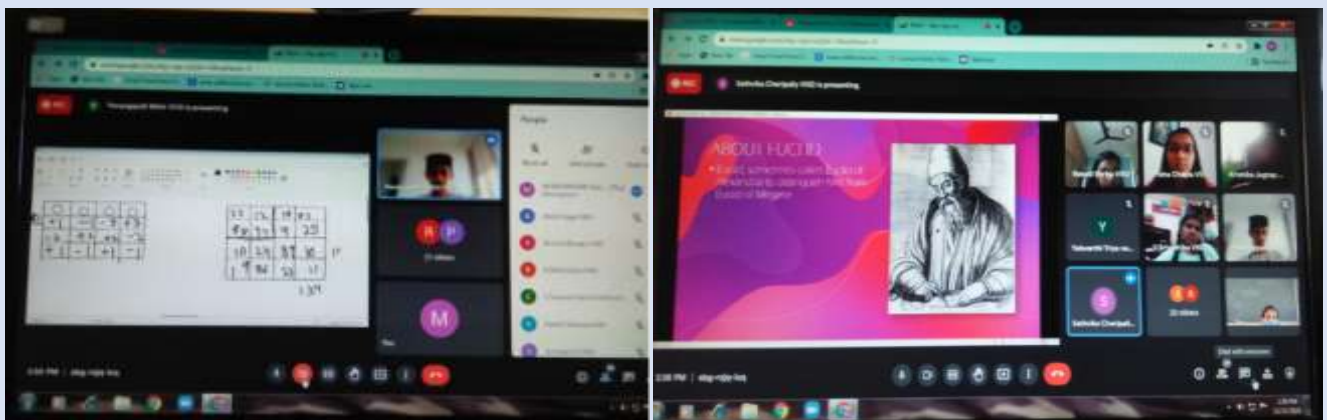
